SPECIAL ORDER

Loan No. 21, 1956, £20,000

THE Auckland Metropolitan Drainage Board, in exercise of the powers vested in it by the Auckland Metropolitan Drainage Act 1944, and in pursuance of the authority conferred on it under the Local Bodies' Finance Act 1921-22, the Local Bodies' Loans Act 1926, the Local Government Loans Board Act 1926, and their respective amendments, and in exercise of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby resolve by special resolution intended to operate as a special order to borrow the sum of £20,000 (twenty thousand pounds) to be designated "Loan No. 21, 1956, £20,000" for the purpose of repaying the balance of the Auckland and Suburban Drainage Board Loan No. 11, 1936, £104,000—Portion £50,000 falling due on the 1st day of September 1956.

The foregoing special order was made by way of a special resolution passed at a special meeting of the Board held on the 4th day of July 1956. It was publicly notified in the *Auckland Star* on the 7th and 21st days of July 1956 and confirmed at the annual meeting of the Board held on the 1st day of August 1956.

An Act to reconstitute the Boy Scouts Association (New Zealand Branch) Incorporated and to change its name.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Boy Scouts Association (New Zealand Branch) Incorporated intends to apply by petition to the General Assembly of New Zealand at its present session for leave to apply to bring in a private Bill, the short title of which is "An Act to reconstitute the Boy Scouts Association (New Zealand Branch) Incorporated and to change its name", to effect the following objects:

(a) To change the name and constitution of the body corporate incorporated under the provisions of the Boy Scouts Association (New Zealand Branch) Incorporation Act 1941 and to adopt the name "The Boy Scouts Association of New Zealand" as the name of the said body corporate.

(b) To provide for the formal recording of such change of name in all instruments, titles, and other documents.

(c) To vest in the Boy Scouts Association of New Zealand all the properties and the powers and authorities vested in the Boy Scouts Association (New Zealand Branch) Incorporated.

(d) To provide for the adoption, registration, and amendment of the constitution and bylaws of the Boy Scouts Association of New Zealand.

(e) To repeal the Boy Scouts Association (New Zealand Branch) Incorporation Act 1941.
