ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 3rd day of August 1966

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to sections 50 and 51 of the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Avondale College Board of Governors Order 1966.

2. The Board of Governors of Avondale College shall be constituted as follows:

- (a) One member appointed by the Auckland Education Board;
- (b) Six members elected by the parents of the pupils attending the school;
- (c) One member appointed by the Auckland City Council;
- (d) One member appointed by the Avondale Old Pupils' Association;
- (e) One member co-opted by the Board itself, if and when it thinks fit.

3. The Order in Council made on the 12th day of May 1953*, constituting the Board of Managers of Avondale Technical School, is hereby revoked.
